Buena Park Receives \$500k for Security Cameras and Lighting Upgrades

Buena Park, Calif. – The City of Buena Park has been awarded \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds from Supervisor Doug Chaffee and the County of Orange and for added security cameras and lighting upgrades around the city. The installation of security cameras and lighting at various locations, including Ralph B. Clark Park, William Peak Park, George Bellis Park, and others will promote an increase in safety and security for the community.

Security cameras in public spaces provide Buena Park Police Department with an additional proactive policing tool that helps deter crime, but also provides important evidence when needed. Recently, a hit-and-run crime was solved, in part, due to a recently-installed camera at Rick Gomez Park.



Enhanced lighting at local parks and public areas provides an

added layer of security for patrons and the surrounding neighborhoods. Illuminating dark areas enhances the images captured by surrounding security cameras and provides better views of the area.

The City of Buena Park thanks Supervisor Doug Chaffee and the County of Orange for providing the ARPA funding to make these necessary improvements that enhance the safety and wellbeing of the Buena Park community.
